- 1 "All that the Father gives Me will come to Me, and the one who
- 2 comes to Me I will certainly not cast out. For I have come down
- 3 from heaven, not to do My own will, but the will of Him who sent

- 5 given Me I lose nothing, but raise it up on the last day. For this is

- Truly, truly, I say to you, he who believes has eternal life. I am the
- bread of life. Your fathers ate the manna in the wilderness, and
- 21 they died. This is the bread which comes down out of heaven, so
- 22 that one may eat of it and not die. I am the living bread that came
- down out of heaven; if anyone eats of this bread, he will live
- 24 forever; and the bread also which I will give for the life of the
- world is My flesh." Then the Jews *began* to argue with one
- another, saying, "How can this man give us *His* flesh to eat?" So
- 27 Jesus said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless you eat the
- 28 flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you have no life in
- 29 yourselves. He who eats My flesh and drinks My blood has eternal
- 30 life, and I will raise him up on the last day. For My flesh is true
- food, and My blood is true drink. He who eats My flesh and drinks
- 32 My blood abides in Me, and I in him. As the living Father sent
- 33 Me, and I live because of the Father, so he who eats Me, he also
- will live because of Me. This is the bread which came down out of
- heaven; not as the fathers ate and died; he who eats this bread will
- 36 live forever." These things He said in the synagogue as He taught
- in Capernaum. Therefore many of His disciples, when they heard
- 38 *this* said, "This is a difficult statement; who can listen to it?"

- Is there an example to follow?
