The Gospel According to John 8:28 – 47

1 So Jesus said, "When you lift up the Son of Man, then you will 2 know that I am He, and I do nothing on My own initiative, but I 3 speak these things as the Father taught Me. And He who sent Me 4 is with Me; He has not left Me alone, for I always do the things 5 that are pleasing to Him." As He spoke these things, many came 6 to believe in Him. So Jesus was saying to those Jews who had 7 believed Him, "If you continue in My word, then you are truly 8 disciples of Mine; and you will know the truth, and the truth will make vou free." They answered Him, "We are Abraham's 9 descendants and have never yet been enslaved to anyone; how is it 10 11 that You say, 'You will become free'?" Jesus answered them, 12 "Truly, truly, I say to you, everyone who commits sin is the slave 13 of sin. The slave does not remain in the house forever; the son 14 does remain forever. So if the Son makes you free, you will be 15 free indeed. I know that you are Abraham's descendants; yet you 16 seek to kill Me, because My word has no place in you. I speak the things which I have seen with My Father; therefore you also do the 17 18 things which you heard from your father." They answered and 19 said to Him, "Abraham is our father." Jesus *said to them, "If you 20 are Abraham's children, do the deeds of Abraham. But as it is, 21 you are seeking to kill Me, a man who has told you the truth, 22 which I heard from God; this Abraham did not do. You are doing 23 the deeds of your father." They said to Him, "We were not born 24 of fornication; we have one Father: God." Jesus said to them, "If 25 God were your Father, you would love Me, for I proceeded forth 26 and have come from God, for I have not even come on My own 27 initiative, but He sent Me. Why do you not understand what I am 28 saying? It is because you cannot hear My word. You are of your 29 father the devil, and you want to do the desires of your father. He 30 was a murderer from the beginning, and does not stand in the truth 31 because there is no truth in him. Whenever he speaks a lie, he 32 speaks from his own *nature*, for he is a liar and the father of lies. 33 But because I speak the truth, you do not believe Me. Which one 34 of you convicts Me of sin? If I speak truth, why do you not believe 35 Me? He who is of God hears the words of God; for this reason 36 you do not hear them, because you are not of God."

- Is there a command to obey?
- Is there a promise to be thankful for?
- Is there an attribute of God to worship?
- Is there an example to follow?
