Parallel ("Chiastic") Structures in Psalms

Chiasm (or chiasmus), from the Greek word for crosswise or crosspiece $(\chi \iota \acute{\alpha} \sigma \mu \nu \varsigma)^1$. The word begins with the letter chi ("khee"), χ , similar in appearance to the English letter "X" and illustrates the "crosswise" structure.

Example from Psalm 26:4 (NABRE)

I do not sit with worthless men,

nor with hypocrites do I mingle.

Chiastic structures are often illustrated using letters to represent the parallel ideas. For example:

- (A) I do not sit
 - (B) with worthless men,
 - (B) nor with hypocrites
- (A) do I mingle.

Some structures are even more intricate. Example from Psalm 90:1-2 (NASB)

- ¹ Lord, You have been our dwelling place in all generations.
- ² Before the mountains were born

Or You gave birth to the earth and the world,

Even from everlasting to everlasting, You are God.

The structure of these verses can be illustrated as follows:

- (A) Lord,
 - (B) You have been our dwelling place
 - (C) in all generations.
 - (D) Before the mountains
 - (E) were born
 - (E) Or You gave birth
 - (D) to the earth and the world,
 - (C) Even from everlasting to everlasting,
 - (B) You are
- (A) God.
