Chiasm

The beauty and power of Scripture are not only in the content but also often in the form or style.

Chiasm is a fascinating literary feature that is seldom used in English but is employed frequently by biblical authors, especially in the Old Testament. In a chiasm a list of items, ideas, or events is structured in such a manner that the first item parallels the last item, the second item parallels the next to last item, and so forth.¹
